We also created a cab seat display that demonstrates the clever swivel seat design, helping visitors get a feel for the front cabin experience and smart use of space. These displays are an invitation to step inside and imagine the adventures that await.


Throughout the year, we'll be rolling out training sessions, toolbox talks, and new safety initiatives to keep best

FAIRFAX MOULD SHOP BACK IN ACTION

Following inspection and final sign-off, the Fairfax moulding workshop officially resumed operations on Tuesday 22 May. All three moulds are now up and running, with semi-trailers underway in Moulds 1 and 2, and a truck body in Mould 3. The first 2025 shells are set to roll out by the end of May, an exciting milestone for the team.

The moulding workshop is classed as a hazardous area, an environment where explosive or flammable gases may be present in quantities that require special safety precautions. In preparation for the restart, the space has undergone significant upgrades. Non-moulding activities have been relocated, allowing shell production to remain the sole operation in the front workshop.

Critical equipment has also been refreshed. The team is now working with brand-new air hoists, upgraded spray guns, refurbished vacuum pumps, and other intrinsically safe tools designed to support both safety and efficiency. One of the most significant improvements is the new ventilation system, which, alongside all other changes, has created a much safer and cleaner environment for the team.

We're proud of the work that's gone into revitalising this important space. Keep an eye out next month as we share photos of the first 2025 shells coming out of the moulds!

Rather than see them head to landfill, the team saw potential. With a bit of creativity and teamwork, those materials are now enjoying a second life, as bean bags in our staff room.

It's a small change, but one that reflects a bigger shift in how we look at waste across the business. The team has also been experimenting with using soft plastic waste as filler, trialling new ways to cut down what we send to landfill.
